- identify subject
- indicate importance
- state your position

#### **II. Body (6 - 8 sentences)**

- indicate 3 arguments for your opinion
- provide 3 facts in favour of your opinion

### **III. Conclusion (2 - 3 sentences)**

- restate your opinion or position on the issue
- present an emotional appeal
